Art

Last week we practised creating patterns in clay. Today we are going to use the skills we have practised to create a clay pot. If you don't have any clay you could use salt dough or play dough. Cut a piece of clay, salt dough or play dough. Now find a cardboard tube (or something similar) and some different tools/ objects you could use to create patterns. Wrap your clay, salt dough or playdough around the tube to create a pot. Now add a piece to the bottom to create a base. Smooth the edges so they create a join. Now think about the type of pattern you'd like to make. Create a repeating pattern using the tools you have found. Leave your pot to dry and send a photo to the email address below. It would be great to see some of your creations.
